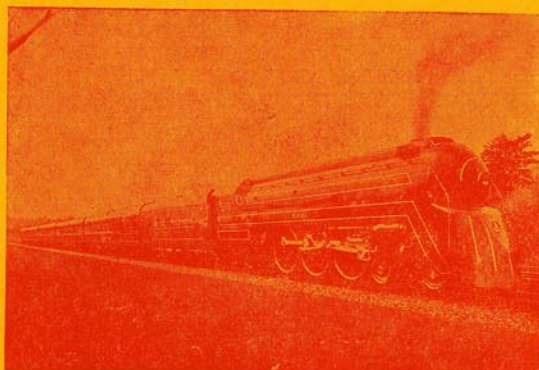

CAMERA TRAIN PROGRAM

The Baltimore & Ohio Railroad and the Hobby Mart welcome you and your children to an afternoon of fun and railroading and hope you will obtain many fine pictures to remember this outing by.

Just a word about safety. At the various picture stops, please don't step on tops of rails, step over the rails. Also look both ways when crossing the tracks. Please walk not run when returning to the train - we've plenty of time to be safe, always.

Our first picture stop is at Newark shops, where steam locomotives and the famous doodle-bug and a caboose will be on display. This gives you a chance to take photos of Junior in the engine cab and yourselves too, so you will get some good pictures for "Ye olde Family Album." We have about 45 minutes here, and will recall you to the train with four blasts of our train-whistle, not only at this stop, but all others as well.

Next picture stop is at the rock cut in Black Hand Gorge for 30 minutes. Your photo possibilities here are very good. Third stop is at Toboso, a particularly scenic spot and we'll be there for a half hour also.

Between Newark and Zanesville, you will see a great deal of the new relocation of the B & O Railroad in connection with the Dillon Dam Project.

We plan to unload all you camera fans at the second and third stops and then back the train up after everybody is clear of the track. We'll have the engineer then move the train forward slowly, to enable you to get some nice movies, which we believe you will really like. So lets everybody cooperate and things will work out fine.

If we stay on schedule, we'll also stop at Putnam hill just west of the Muskingum river for a few minutes for pictures, then pull on into Zanesville station where we'll remain until 5:45 p.m., leaving immediately after arrival of the eastbound passenger train No. 238. During this time you may want to walk over town, see the "Y" bridge, and the Muskingum Dam, or the canal about two blocks south of the B. & O. station. Picture possibilities abound along rivers and bridges.

We have a lunch counter car in the middle of the train serving hot coffee, hot dogs, cakes and doughnuts and soft drinks and milk, at reasonable prices.

The baggage cars on the train have their doors open and safety barred so you can ride in them and shoot pictures from the moving train.

Lets have loads of fun, but remember, be back on the train at Zanesville by 5:45 p.m. We must get home before the kiddies bed-time.
