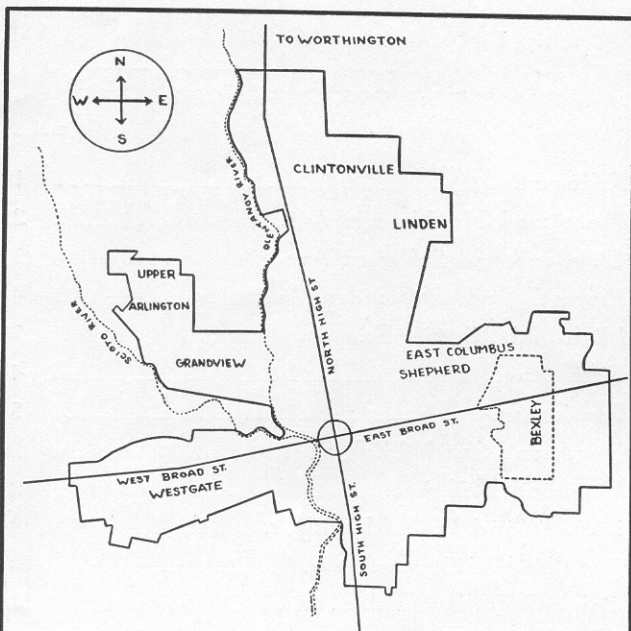

COLUMBUS — FACTS AND HISTORY

Columbus was founded 142 years ago, at the spot where the Olentangy River joined the Scioto; known then as a part of the Northwest Territory.

In 1797, on the west bank of the Scioto, a little village sprung up which was called Franklinton, after Benjamin Franklin.

In 1803, Ohio became the first state west of the Appalachians, and in 1812, the General Assembly established the seat of government on the east bank of the Scioto, opposite Franklinton, naming the new capitol "Columbus", after America's discoverer.

Franklinton was merged with Columbus in 1834.

Today — Columbus is a friendly, hospitable city, proud of her past, inspired by fine leadership, located in the heart of a great state.

Columbus, being the seat of the state government, is the home of many important state institutions, Ohio State University as well as 3 other colleges, many beautiful parks, and a widely diversified number of industries.

The Columbus and Southern Ohio Electric Co., operates 142 street cars, 78 trolley coaches and 54 motor buses over 92 miles of routes in this city ready to take you to or within walking distance of most places of interest in the city . . . 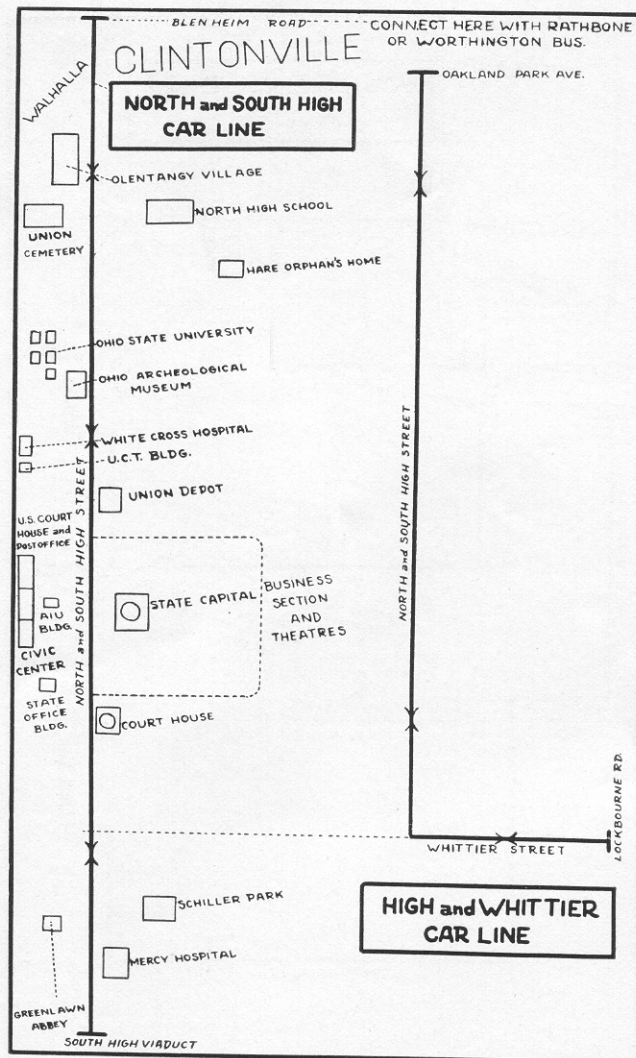
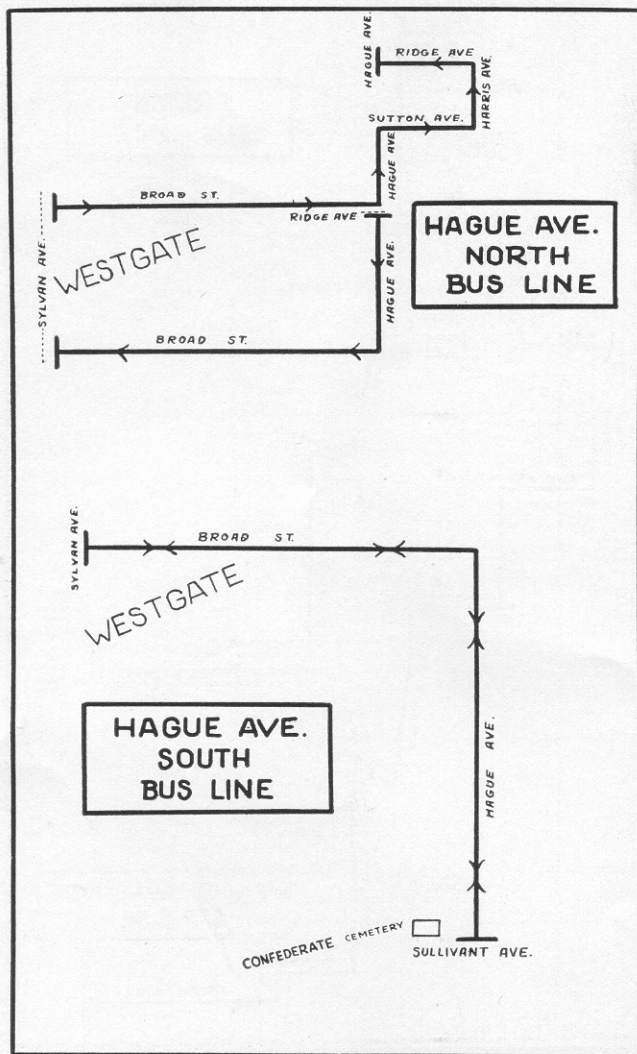


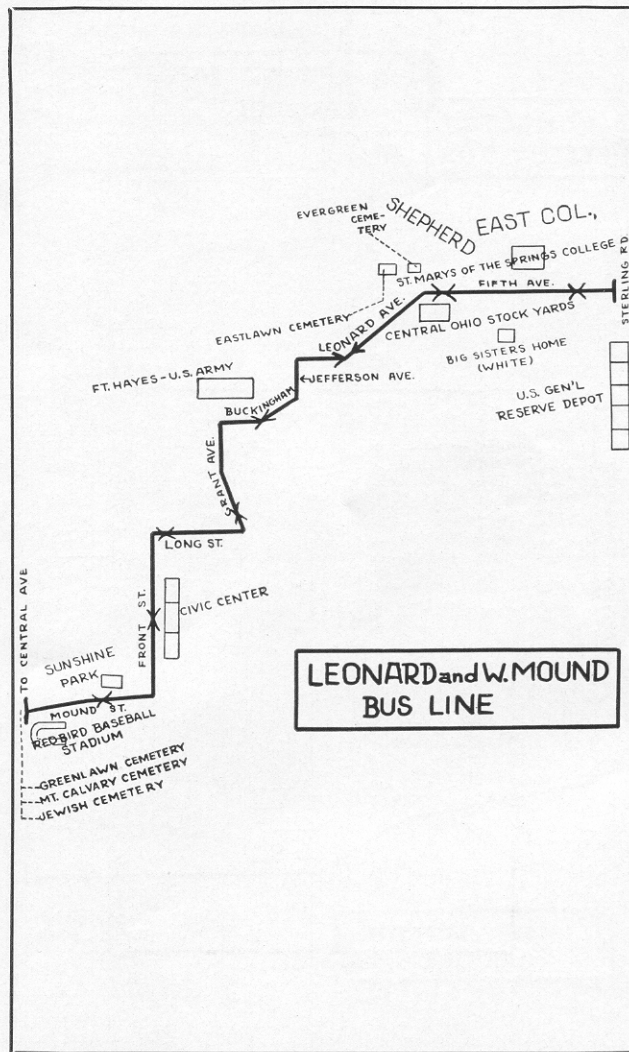
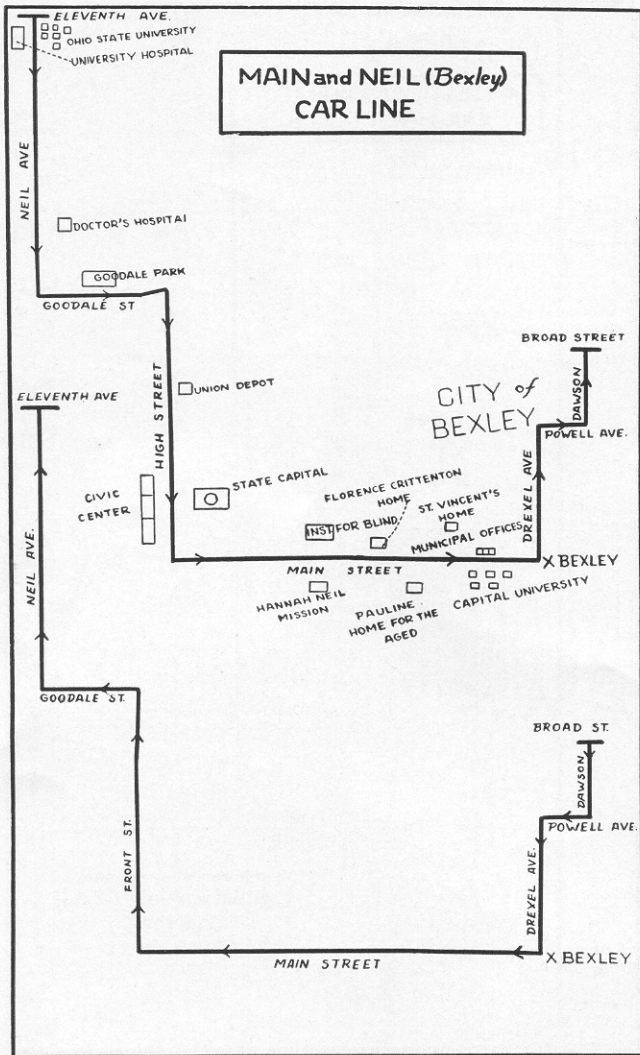
ELEVENTH and CHITTENDEN BUS LINE

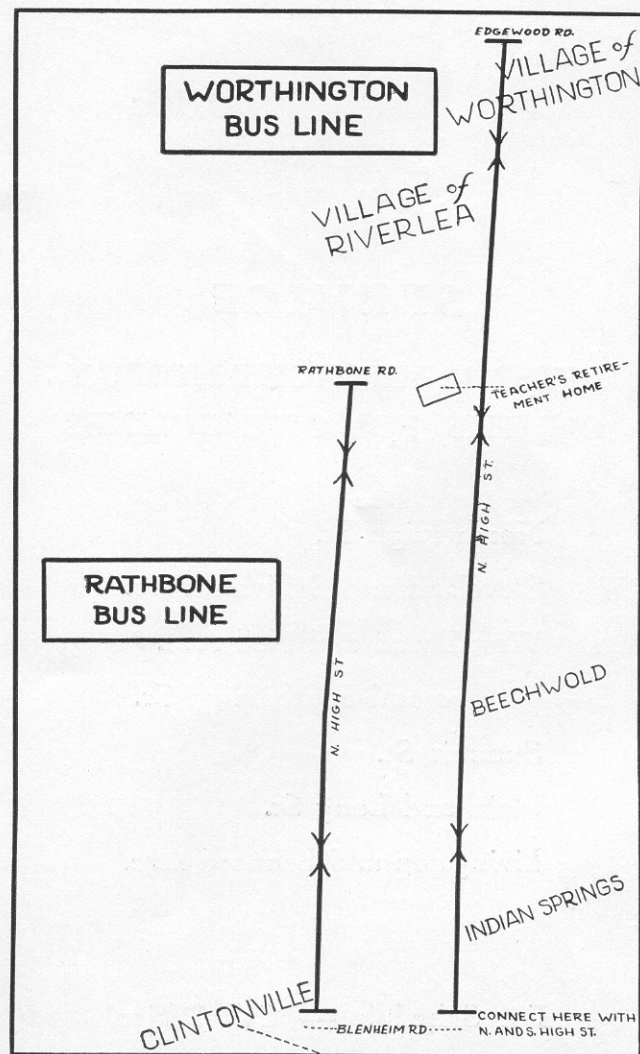
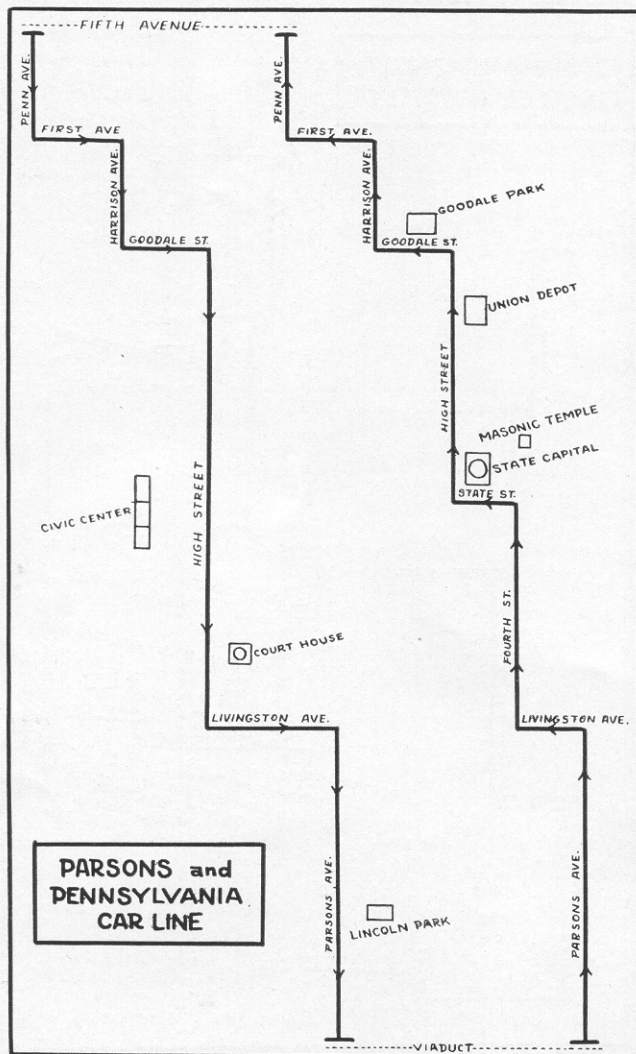
