Dear Sir:-

Referring to your letter Aug. 14th in regard to N.Y.N.H. & H. 70559, Lumber consigned to The Columbus Coffin Co., which you delivered to us Aug. 5th, and not delivered to The Coffin Co. until Aug. 13th.

I have investigated with our General Yard Master who advises as follows:-

"Referring to the handling of NYNH&H 70559:

This car was received from the N&W Aug. 5th, for the Columbus Coffin Company. The Car was shopped for repairs and placed in the shop same date. Car was repaired and came out of the shop on the afternoon of Aug. 6th, listed as empty, and evidently no cards on it at that time, and was switched to Yard C and placed with empties for the freight house. It remained there until Aug. 11th, when it was discovered to be loaded with lumber and was then switched out and sent to Yard D for delivery to the Columbus Coffin Company?
