This newsletter is primarily intended to provide additional information on the chapter meeting at the Age of Steam Roundhouse on 15 September.

The starting time is 1 pm. You should arrive a little early to facilitate getting organized for the tour. As mentioned in the last newsletter, it will be a guided tour. Please bring your signed release form. The release form is required to gain entrance to the roundhouse property. If you sent your form to Dick Briggs with your payment he will return the form to you at the roundhouse.

Please remember to read and heed the restrictions for permission to enter the facility, namely, wear closed sided shoes with hard soles, (no open toes, sandals or beach thongs). Stay on hard surfaces at all times. These restrictions are for your safety. Wear old clothes, as this is a working environment. Stay with your tour guide at all times.

As you drive in the area remember that you are in Amish territory. Be alert for horse and buggy traffic on all the roads.

There will be no food available at the roundhouse, so lunch is recommended before you arrive. Fast food establishments are available in the Millersburg area. Sugarcreek should have restaurants in the area; however, many Amish run facilities are not open on Sundays. One restaurant that has been recommended is the Chalet in the Valley restaurant located on Ohio Route 557 a short distance west of the Village of Charm. Prices range from \$8.95, and up. Sunday hours are 11 am to 3 pm. This restaurant is approximately fifteen miles west of the Age of Steam Roundhouse.

Due to the nature of this gathering there will be no business meeting.
